Minutes of the Annual Business Meeting October 26, 2013, at UW – Eau Claire, Eau Claire, WI

After a wonderful and fun morning talk/poster session and wrapping up the Cray talk/video, we all headed to the business lunch meeting. The AP Physics lunch discussion was going on in another room...

Meeting Start Time: 12:30 pm (which is actually quite a few minutes late). President Phil Young presiding. His first order of business was to thank the UWEC folks for a job well-done in bringing WAPT to UW – Eau Claire. These thanks, of course, go to all of the people working behind the scenes, as well. Loud clapping acknowledged their excellent work!

1. Minutes of the last meeting (October 27th, 2012) – Erik Hendrickson

Motion to accept the minutes (on yellow paper) as corrected (there was a typo on page 3) was made by Matt Evans, seconded by Jim Madsen. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

2. Treasurer's Report for 2011-12 - Erik Hendrickson

- A. It was reported that our 1-yr CD earned \$13.20 last year. Expenses were described briefly, including the costs of last year's meeting.

Remember, the idea is to include the "1st timer" awards on the meeting registration page that offers \$50 awards to the first 10 people who register for their first WAPT meeting ever and for the first 3 people who register who are from a two year college. For people who are driving to the meeting and need lodging, the awards are \$50. For local attendees, the award covers the cost of the meeting (dues, lunch, etc.). Make sure to invite new people from your schools to attend and sign up for these perks!
- C. Motion to accept the printed treasurer's report as distributed was made by Lowell McCann, seconded by Melissa Vigil. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

3. Section Representative's Report - Jim Mallmann

- A. Jim pointed out that the AAPT is looking for all of us to encourage new members to join (and for each of us to join, as well!). They would really like to create more connections between local and national issues.
- B. Jim noted that the Winter AAPT Meeting is in Orlando, FL, and the Summer Meeting is in Minneapolis, MN (this is close enough that many of us should get involved). Just to plan ahead, the following Winter Meeting (2015) is in San Diego, CA, and the Summer 2015 meeting is at the University of Maryland.
- C. He reminded us that if anyone would like to serve on any of the national committees (there are 18 different "area" committees), he could nominate you. The National Office would like to get more members involved at the national level. Remember, even if you are not a member of a national committee, you can be a friend of a national committee (you still attend the meetings, get emails about the happenings, etc.).

 - E. Motion to accept the report was made by Mike, seconded by Jim Madsen. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

4. High School Representative's Report - Matt Evans (in place of Gary Baier, who is at the AP Physics discussion)

- C. There will once again be a 2-week summer course at UWRF for high school teachers. Think about attending or encouraging colleagues to attend.
- D. Motion to accept the report was made by Lowell McCann, seconded by Brad Hinaus. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

5. Two-Year College Representative's Report - Cary Woodward

Again, please see Cary's full written report (which was distributed on blue paper), what follows are his highlights...

- A. Main issue: Non-traditional teaching modes. This includes "Flex Option" programs and concurrent enrollment
- B. More high school teachers are wanting to teach the 2-year college courses as concurrent enrollments, but many of them do not have the requisite physics background, so they are being turned down. The 4-year schools should be aware of what this may imply, regarding the transfer students they may eventually see.

- C. Enrollments for physics students has remained stable. This is mainly due to collaborative engineering programs.
- D. Motion to accept the report was made by Lowell McCann, seconded by Melissa Vigil. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

6. Committee Reports

a) Awards Committee - Matt Evans (in place of Paul Nevins, who was not present)

There were no nominations this year.

Are the timings of the parallel sessions working for people? Do we need a new format for workshops? Please give Melissa or Matt feedback on this issue.

One suggestion: Is there a way to create a talk schedule that coordinates the talks with the workshops?
